

In 2015, the United Nations launched the Sustainable Development Goals as a global call to action to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people live in peace and prosperity by 2030. Governance that is not founded on the rule of law, human rights, peace and stability cannot be sustainable. Considering the global situation, especially in the last 25 years, on the one hand, there are regions where security is ensured and where people live in peace and prosperity, while on the other hand, regions with conflict and violence have increased and instability has been reinforced. Sustainable development cannot be realized without tackling this inequality.

Through SDG 16 Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions, the UN aims to reduce all forms of violence and related mortality everywhere; end child abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence and torture; promote the rule of law at national and international levels; and ensure equal access to justice for all. Furthermore, by 2030, the UN also seeks to significantly reduce illicit financial and arms flows; strengthen the recovery and return of stolen assets and combat all forms of organized crime; reduce all forms of corruption and bribery; develop effective, accountable and transparent institutions at all levels; ensure responsive, inclusive, participatory and representative decision-making processes at all levels; and expand and strengthen the participation of developing countries in global governance institutions. By 2030, SDG 16 targets ensuring legal identity for all, including birth registration, ensuring access to information for communities and protecting fundamental freedoms in accordance with national legislation and international agreements, strengthening relevant national institutions, including through international cooperation, to build capacity at all levels to prevent violence and combat terrorism and crime, particularly in developing countries, and promoting and implementing non-discriminatory laws and policies for sustainable development.

Times Higher Education, which ranks universities according to their activities related to the Sustainable Development Goals, aims to encourage universities to contribute to humanity and a better and more sustainable life through the Times Impact Rankings, the first global ranking in this field. Under the SDG 16 Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions, THE focuses on how universities can support institutions in their countries and promote peace and justice. To do this, it assesses universities' research in law and international relations, their involvement as advisors to governments, and their policies on academic freedom. THE evaluates

universities on the SDG 16 on representation in university governance, student communities, relations with local stakeholders, anti-corruption and anti-bribery, academic freedom, financial transparency, relations with government agencies, and law courses in the curriculum.
